This net is held weekly and encourages checkins regardless of location, affiliation, or license class. All properly licensed amateurs are invited to participate. This net allows hams to voice opinions or ask questions concerning the amateur community in general or the RATS club specifically. If a question goes unanswered during the net I will contact the appropriate person to get an answer for next week’s net.

When checking in please give your call sign and first name to be recognized by net control. Also state if you have any announcements or other traffic for the net. Traffic will be handled first, and then informal comments will be handled last.

First we’ll take mobile and portable stations. Mobiles and portables, please call now, this is _____?

RATS also operates the W4RAT DMR repeater on 443.5875 MHz and a network of APRS digipeaters around the region.
